PASTORAL NOTE

PEACE OF CHRIST FOR THE BODY: EMBRACING WHOLENESS IN THE NEW YEAR.

s we step into the New Year, we're often met with mixed emotions - hope, excitement, but also worry, fear, and anxiety. The uncertainties of life can weigh us down sometimes. Yet, God's promise remains true: "The peace of God, which surpasses all human understanding, shall overshadow us" (Psalm 60:12).

This peace isn't just spiritual; it encompasses our entire being - body, soul, and spirit. In this series, we'll explore the peace of Christ, starting with its impact on our physical well-being. In subsequent newsletters, I will write about peace of Christ on soul and church.

The Peace of Christ for the body means restoration to Wholeness.

The Hebrew concept of "shalom" (peace) means more than just absence of conflict; it's about restoration to wholeness. When Adam and Eve sinned, humanity's

relation with creation became broken. But through Jesus Christ, God reconciled us back and restored our relationship with Creator of the universe (2 Corinthian 5 vs 18-19.

This restoration through Jesus Christ extends to our physical bodies. Christ's peace calms our fears, soothing our worries about our health, safety, and general wellbeing. As believers, we know God's peace surrounds us, guarding our hearts and minds (Philippians 4:7).

Practical Applications

In 2025, As we seek to relate the peace of Christ to our physical health and daily life, let us consider the following:

- 1: We can care for God's creation, recognizing our role as stewards, as instructed in Genesis 2:15. By living sustainably, reducing waste, and conserving resources, we honor God's design and preserve the planet God created.
- 2: Promoting peaceful relationships with those around us is crucial. Showing kindness, empathy, and understanding, as taught in Matthew 22:39, promotes harmony in our neighborhoods.
- 3: Prioritizing self-care is also essential. Recognizing our bodies as temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Corinthians 6:19-20), we should engage in regular exercise, healthy eating, rest, and relaxation.
- 4: Engaging in local initiatives promoting peace, justice, and compassion demonstrates our commitment to Christ's peace.

As we begin this New Year, may the peace of Christ envelop our bodies, calming fears and anxieties. May we trust God's sovereignty over our physical health, caring for His creation and our neighbors, prioritizing self-care and community involvement, and finding rest in His presence. The glory of God shall indeed rest upon our lives. The storms of life won't blow us away, nor will we be scorched by life's challenges. We'll stand firm, anchored in Christ's peace.

Happy New Year! May God's peace be our constant companion.

We offer a free lunch each Tuesday at noon, everyone is welcome to come and try our delicious cuisine which includes




many popular dishes: soup and sandwiches or a hot entrée also a choice of salads and a variety of different desserts.
