The Story behind orange shirt Day. If you don't know. now you know...





Orange shirt day was created by Phyllis Webstad of Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation. She tells the powerful story of having her orange shirt taken away when she attended a residential school as well as her language, culture and childhood joy. Orange shirt day became widely recognized, but never more so than this year.

orangeshirtdayac Phyllis (Jack) Webstad's Story Part 1

"I went to the Mission for one school year in 1973/1974. I had just turned 6 years old. I lived with my grandmother on the Dog Creek reserve. We never had very much money, but somehow my granny managed to buy me a new outfit to go to the Mission school. I remember going to Robinson's store and picking out a shiny orange shirt. It had string laced up in front, and was so bright and exciting - just like I felt to be going to school!

When I got to the Mission, they stripped me, and took away my clothes, including the orange shirt! I never wore it again. I didn't understand why they wouldn't give it back to me, it was mine! The color orange has always reminded me of that and how my feelings didn't matter, how no one cared and how I felt like I was worth nothing. All of us little children were crying and no one cared."



Sept 30th is the First National Day for Truth and Reconciliation chosen as a symbol of the time of year when the children were taken from their homes and sent to residential schools.





We continue to experience growth in Riverside United Church children ministry. The children are superb joy to the community and we cherished their dedication and support in our worship service. May God continue to bless all the children and their parents. Amen.
